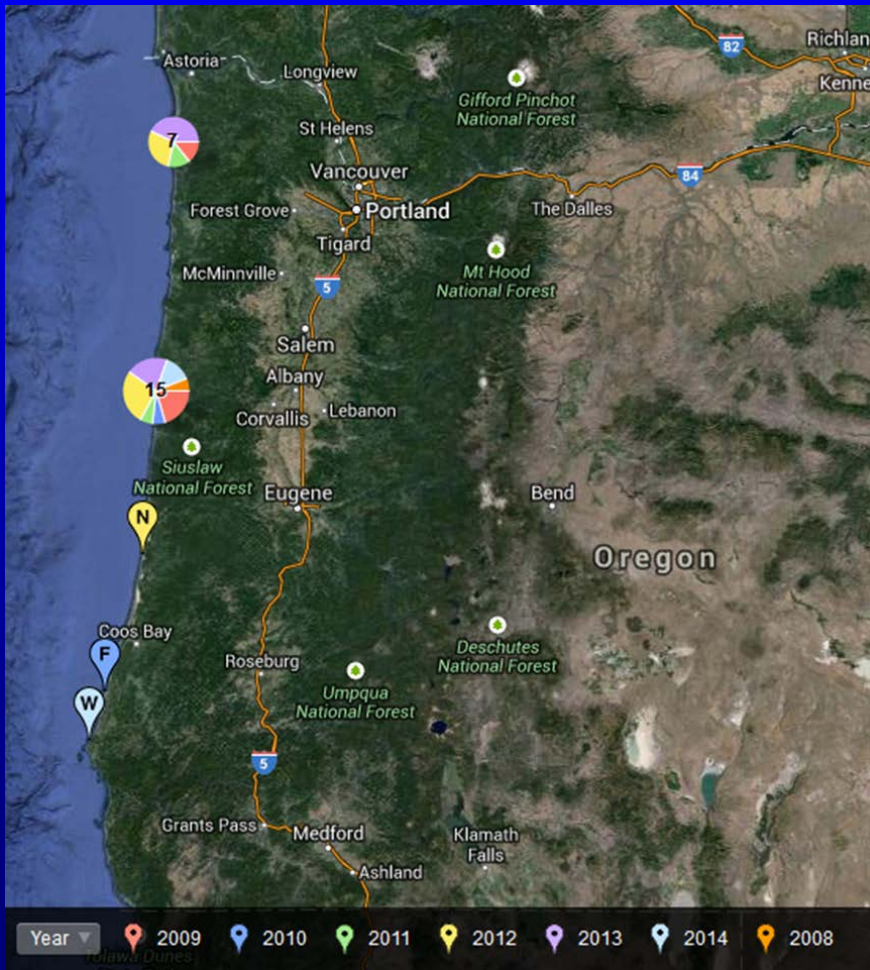


Are Sea Otters Returning to Oregon?
